Lee Hayward White, Sr. was born in Albany, Georgia on March 15, 1923 to Ester Clark and Losko White. He died on Monday, December 20, 2004 at Phoebe Putney Memorial Hospital.

He was educated in the Doughty County School System and graduated from Madison High School. He joined the United States Army on November 7, 1941, and was honorably discharged on December 9, 1945. Lee Hayward was a World War II veteran and received several citations: The American Defense Service Medal, The American Service Medal, The European African Middle Eastern Service Medal with 2 Bronze Stars, The Asiatic Pacific Service Medal and the World War II Victory Medal.

Lee Hayward mastered many trades. He was a professional brick Layer and landscaper. He was the owner and operator of *White and Sons' Landscaping*.

A lifelong member of Hines, Lee Hayward had served as a Steward and as Superintendent of the Sunday School. He was presently serving as a Trustee. He was a member of the International Union of the BAC and held numerous offices in the Local Union of the BAC from Financial Secretary to President.

Lee Hayward met and married Ada Williams in 1970.
